



ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT – COMMUNITY SERVICES

April 28, 2010

- The Covenant Administration Department is planning a Community Involvement Day for the Shadowcreek / Woodstock neighborhoods in the Village of Panther Creek on June 14th as part of the Community Revitalization Program. Prior to this event, several individual property improvement projects are being coordinated through the program including the clean-up of both Post Offices.
- Revisions to the Residential Standards are being finalized and will be considered in an upcoming joint meeting of the design committees.
- Construction of Town Center Hardscape/Landscape Projects is in progress and will continue for the next 90 days. This includes new pathways, improvements to existing pathways and landscaping along Woodloch Forest Dr., Six Pines Dr., Timberloch Pl., Waterway Av., Lake Robbins Dr. and Waterway Square Ct.
- The 20th Anniversary of Earth Day was a tremendous success, in spite of the weather, with over 5,000 in attendance.
- The Environmental Services Department has initiated the mosquito trapping program for the season. Higher than normal mosquito activity is predicted this year. The program will focus on persistent “hot spots” in the community.
- The CB&I Triathlon has sold out with over 1,100 registrations. The Triathlon will be held on May 1st at Northshore Park. Notice of traffic lane closures are being advertised in the newspapers and with road way signage.
- The Parks and Recreation Department will host a National Playground Safety Inspector Certification Course and Exam May 10 - 12 at the Service Center. The Course is sponsored by the National Recreation and Park Association and provides the most comprehensive and widely recognized training available on playground hazard identification and risk management. Over thirty participants from around the state have registered to attend.
- Park Rangers have increased the number of hours of patrols and inspections of the pathways throughout The Woodlands to create more visibility in the parks and pathways. Park Rangers travel along the pathways on small motorized vehicles or “Mules”.
- Request for Proposals (RFP) are being solicited for the Stationary Designated Public Space Vending Permits. The RFP is for 12 locations in Town Green Park, Northshore Park, Waterway Square and along the Waterway. Permits will allow Selected Vendors to sell food, beverages, merchandise, goods and services. Permits will be awarded by the Board in May or June.
- Bids currently being solicited include: Pathway Improvements; Electrical Services; Plumbing Services; and Pond Maintenance Services.
