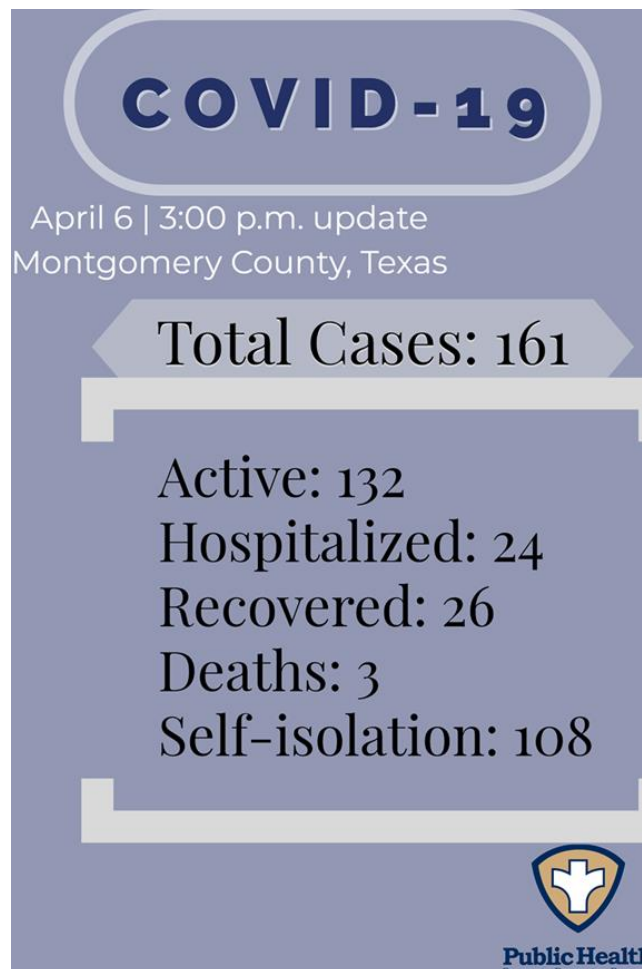
Status Update from the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

MONTGOMERY COUNTY – Montgomery County Public Health District, in conjunction with Montgomery County Office of Emergency Management, can confirm there are now 161 positive cases of COVID-19, up 12 cases from yesterday. The CDC continues to recommend cloth face masks for the general public when leaving your home is **necessary**.
