Vaccination Dashboard

Stay informed about the distribution and administration of the COVID-19 vaccine in Texas.

COVID-19 Texas Vaccination Data Dashboard

A new dashboard is available through the Texas Department of State Health Services showing COVID-19 vaccination data in Texas. The dashboard has many aspects of important information in sum and by county for variables including vaccine distribution, type of organizations receiving the distributions, doses administered and people vaccinated. <u>View the dashboard</u>.

In addition, the CDC provides updated national information online daily. As of December 21, 2020, in the United States, there have been 17,790,376 confirmed cases of COVID-19 detected

through U.S. public health surveillance systems in 50 states and the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the Northern Marianas Islands, and U.S. Virgin Islands. CDC's COVID Data Tracker now has a <u>County View</u> to help make decisions about everyday activities.



COVID-19 Testing in The Woodlands

Testing is taking place at The Woodlands Township Town Hall, 2801 Technology Forest Blvd., The Woodlands, Texas 77381, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. Customers are asked to submit their insurance information. Testing is offered at **no cost to the customer**. Customers without insurance will still be tested at **no personal cost** using coverage from the CARES (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) Act. Please note, **WALK-UPS WELCOME**.

Curative has added a **second testing site** in The Woodlands, hosted by the Township, at Sterling Ridge Park and Ride, 8001 McBeth Way. **The site opened December 15, 2020**, and will remain open through January 31, 2021. It is a "self-serve" drive-thru operation with hours from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily.

Please note the following holiday hours for both sites below. These may be different from hours that were published previously:

- Christmas Eve: Thursday, December 24, 2020 Closed
- Christmas Day: Friday, December 25, 2020 Closed
- New Year's Eve: Thursday, December 31, 2020 Closed
- New Year's Day: Friday, January 1, 2021 Closed

Montgomery County COVID-19 Case Count December 22, 2020


Montgomery County Public Health District (MCPHD), in conjunction with the Montgomery County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, is asking residents to closely adhere to CDC guidelines as Montgomery County, and the rest of the nation, experiences record high COVID-19 active cases. It's not too late to follow these guidelines to help reduce the spread of this deadly illness:

- Avoid groups of people.
- Practice social distancing.
- Wear a mask in public (over your nose and mouth) or with others who live outside your household. Never share a mask with others.
- Teach children proper hygiene and the correct way to wear a mask.
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer frequently.
- Disinfect surfaces in your car and around your home.

Montgomery County Public Health confirms the following update related to COVID-19:

- TOTAL cases of COVID-19 increased by 571 to 23,838 since yesterday's (12/21) report. Of the 571 new cases, 508 were tested since 12/10/2020.
- ACTIVE cases of COVID-19 increased by 17 to 6,446 since yesterday's (12/21) report. On Tuesdays, the report includes additional "inactive" cases who have been unable to be contacted for more than 30 days. Today, there were 426 additional inactive cases.
- 37 residents are known, as a result of contact investigations, to be in the hospital. Contact investigations have not been initiated on all reported cases.
- 13,174 people have clinically recovered.

Harris County COVID-19 Case Count

Harris County Public Health (HCPH) publishes their daily case count, combined with the City of Houston's daily case count, here. Cases by zip code in Harris County can be found by clicking on areas of the map.

The Village of Creekside Park is located in two zip codes: 77375 and 77389, and these also include Magnolia, Augusta Pines/Auburn Lakes/West Rayford Road in northwest Harris County. Today, Harris County is reporting zip code 77375 has 2,159 confirmed positive cases with 386 active cases, and 77389 has 1,201 confirmed positive cases with 234 active cases.

Governor Provides Update On COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

On Thursday, December 17, 2020, Governor Greg Abbott held a press conference where he provided an update on the statewide COVID-19 vaccine distribution at the UPS Distribution Center in Austin. About 95,000 doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been delivered to 23 different

The program is free of charge and sends staff and Pfizer vaccines from Walgreens and CVS locations to these facilities.
