 - Playwell/Play Craft-3.00
 - Fun Abounds/Burke-2.86

Next Steps

April 2021 - Board of Directors reviews RFQs and selects firm

May – June 2021 - Plan/design development

July 2021 - Board of Directors receives concept plan and cost

August - October 2021 - Manufacture of playground equipment

October- November 2021 – Installation of playground equipment

December 31, 2021 - Project completion





Recommendation

It is recommended to proceed with Lone Star Recreation for the design and build of Bear Branch Inclusive Playground and authorize the President/General Manager to execute a construction agreement within the budgeted amount, as approved to final form by the Township Attorney. If negotiations fail with Lone Star Recreation the President/General Manager is authorized to negotiate with the second ranking firm, and so on until a fee can be agreed upon.
