Township nature lecture will focus on the survival of red wolves

THE WOODLANDS, TEXAS (April 10, 2013) – Russell Roe, managing editor of Texas Parks and Wildlife Magazine, shares the compelling story of the survival of red wolves at *Walk in the Woods* Nature Lecture on Thursday, April 11, 2013, at 7:30 p.m. in the L.G.I. Lecture Hall at McCullough Junior High School, 3800 S. Panther Creek Drive.

Red wolves were once the top predator across the Southeast, ranging from East Texas across to Florida and as far north as Pennsylvania. “When red wolves started disappearing, no one noticed,” Mr. Roe says.

Red Wolf—the Texas Saga weaves the poignant tale of the predator’s survival, revealing the role that Texas played in the animal's recovery. The compelling story of the animal’s rescue and recovery is a conservation success with many groundbreaking chapters.
